Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been an exceptionally busy time at the academy as we move ever closer to the summer holidays. Last week, all Key Stage 3 students engaged in the Da Vinci Mock Election, coinciding with the general election. During this event, students attended various sessions where they delved into the actions of local MPs, studied the actual policies of major political parties, and learned about the logistics of voting and the workings of the UK's first-past-the-post system.

In the mock election, each tutor group represented one of the 650 national constituencies, giving every student the opportunity to experience democracy first-hand. They voted for one of five staff members, who took on roles as political party candidates. Throughout the week, the school was abuzz with anticipation, healthy debates, and lively discussions. This excitement culminated on election day, only to be met with the poignant question from many students: "Why can't we vote for real?"

Last week saw 85 Year 10 students embark on the world of work during Work Experience week. Students experienced working in a range of industries from education, engineering and aeronautical engineering to customer services, the beauty industry and childcare.
